COURSE DESCRIPTION

HB501 is a course designed to serve as an orientation to a critical study of the Hebrew Bible (HB). This orientation revolves around two cluster issues: (1) the content of the HB and (2) the interpretation of the HB. The study of content includes such matters as canon formation, textual history and transmission, socio-literary composition, and rhetorical structure of the HB. Whereas the matter of interpretation focuses on the interpretive history, analysis of methodological approaches employed by past and present interpreters, and an exploration of problems (i.e. race, class, sex, gender, age, sexual orientation, etc) and hermeneutical methods involved in contemporary readings of the Hebrew Bible (HB). These foci are intended to provide an introduction to the HB for the purposes of religious education and Christian theology in particular.

GOAL: The purpose of this course is to provide students with the foundational knowledge of the Hebrew Bible necessary for a variety of ministry settings. This includes knowledge of the contents of the biblical books, the ability to relate this literature to Israelite history, a broad understanding of the history of biblical interpretation, and skill in using a variety of critical tools and methodologies to exegete texts.

OBJECTIVES

In this course, students will work to meet the following objectives:

- 1. Demonstrate knowledge of the contents of the Hebrew Bible and how these contents relate to Israelite history.
- 2. Develop the ability to think critically about biblical texts using a variety of methodologies and use exegetical tools to analyze individual passages.
- 3. Articulate an informed perspective on the authority of the Hebrew Bible and its relationship to modern Christian life.
