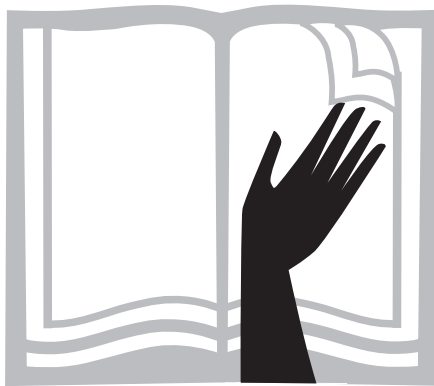

# INTRODUCTION

The publication of *All Creation Sings* provided the opportunity to supplement, revise, and expand *Indexes to Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, published in 2007. Because the Revised Common Lectionary and many hymns and songs are held in common by many denominations, these contents may be helpful as well to those beyond the Lutheran tradition.

## Hymns for the Church Year

The most substantial index in this volume is Hymns for the Church Year. Assembly song suggestions are provided for Sundays and principal festivals, lesser festivals, and occasions as presented in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*. In addition, brief introductions to each lectionary day are provided, along with the day's appointed proper (prayer of the day and gospel acclamation), reading citations, and summaries of the readings.

### Notes on the hymn suggestions

Selecting hymns for worship is a creative and subjective process that differs in each worshipping community. The suggestions in this volume are not meant to be exhaustive or prescriptive. With a rich and diverse offering of up to 20 hymn suggestions for each day, however, most assemblies using *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* and *All Creation Sings* will find something appropriate to their local contexts. Many assemblies may choose to supplement their repertoire with hymns and songs from other sources and in other styles. On most pages, there is space for planners to add their own selections.

For most Sundays and festivals, the first eight items listed are considered *primary* hymns for the day. These hymns and songs are most closely related to the readings and images for the day, especially the gospel. They are suggested not only as the strongest hymn of the day options but are also recommended for other places in the service. Depending on a congregation's context and assembly song repertoire, the additional twelve or so *other appropriate* hymns and songs provide further possibilities for each Sunday and festival.

While other planning volumes arrange hymn suggestions by their relationship to specific readings or their placement in the liturgy, the format in this volume allows worship planners to consider appropriate hymns from several perspectives at once. For example, some hymns with strong scriptural connections to a certain lectionary day may be as appropriate for the gathering or the sending as for the hymn of the day. Of course, hymns can be sung in places other than those suggested, and on other days.

The hymn suggestions in each grid take into consideration the appointed lectionary readings as well as the day or season in the church year. When the grid indicates that a hymn is related to a particular reading, it may mean that particular words, phrases, or images from the scripture reading are also present in the hymn text. It may also mean that the hymn bears a thematic connection to the scripture reading, such as hymns related to love when the gospel text is Jesus' great commandment to love God and neighbor.

Because the gospel is given priority in the lectionary and is the reading on which the sermon is most frequently based in Lutheran settings, the gospel and its themes are also given priority in this volume. On some days there may be more than a dozen hymns that relate to the gospel, and other Sundays there may only be a few. Care has been taken to ensure that virtually every hymn in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* and *All Creation Sings* is suggested on at least one occasion in this volume.

References to the first and second readings are listed when a hymn contain images or themes from well-known passages that may in some circumstances provide the primary text for the sermon. Most of the hymns suggested in the psalm column are psalm paraphrases that could be used in the place of the psalm that day. A preacher or worship planner who wishes to select hymns specific to one or more of the other readings for the day will find the scriptural and topical indexes at the back of this book useful.

A new feature of this volume is the suggestion of at least one hymn connected to the semicontinuous Old Testament reading during the time after Pentecost. The suggested hymn could be used as the hymn of the day when the sermon is based on this reading.

The last column in each grid presents hymns appropriate for a particular day or season in the church year even if they do not include a direct reference to a lectionary reading. The day/season column is not used for the periods of time after Epiphany and after Pentecost, which are characterized by their weekly progression of Sundays. There are two exceptions. First, because the November lectionary themes of the communion of saints, judgment, and end times overlap with Advent lectionary themes in many ways, some Advent hymn suggestions are offered for Lectionary 31–33. Second, some denominations now suggest a season of creation between September 1 and the commemoration of Francis of Assisi on October 4. In this volume, several optional hymns with strong stewardship of creation themes are offered on Lectionary 22–27. In most cases they are suggested for a place in the service other than the hymn of the day as a secondary emphasis for the day.

Finally, a few comments on the placement of hymns and songs in the liturgy. The suggestions offered in this volume are only a starting place. Each assembly will make its own decisions based on its context. In general, the gathering and sending hymn suggestions in this volume may be more familiar to some assemblies. Newer or less familiar hymns have often been suggested as the hymn of the day or as offering song. While the setting of the table may include short hymns or refrains in some communities, others may use this place for an additional hymn, especially if an anthem or solo is sung during communion. In many cases, hymns or songs suggested for communion may also be used as offering song. However, in this volume simpler hymns and songs are usually suggested for communion to accompany the assembly's movement during this time.

## Key to the hymn grids

Categories on the left half of the grid suggest a hymn's placement in the service. Categories on the right half of the grid identify a hymn's relationship to one or more of the appointed lectionary readings, and to the day or season more generally.

## Strategies for learning new hymns and songs

- Use a new tune as a prelude or instrumental piece.
- Rehearse the new hymn or song before the service.
- Introduce the new hymn or song during the offering the first week (perhaps by the choir or a cantor alone), and then use it in other places in the service in future weeks.
- Have the cantor or choir sing one or more stanzas, and then invite the assembly to sing the remainder of the hymn or song.

## Additional Reference Tools

- A complete index to the appointed readings in the three-year Revised Common Lectionary (including *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* additions for lesser festivals, commemorations, and occasions not included in the RCL) arranged in biblical order.
- Scriptural and topical indexes to the hymns in *Evangelical Lutheran Worship* and *All Creation Sings* prepared for the leaders editions. The scriptural index traces biblical images, references, and allusions contained in the hymns; thus, a hymn listed in this index may not always be seasonally fitting for the related reading's place in the lectionary.
- An alternate tune index. Many fine hymn texts paired with music an assembly has not yet learned can be immediately useful when combined with familiar melodies. This list provides an expanded set of examples of how this can be done; other combinations are possible using the metrical tune index.
- Additional indexes as listed on the contents page.

Paired with a comprehensive seasonal planning guide such as *Sundays and Seasons* (Augsburg Fortress, annual) and the online worship planning tool [sundaysandseasons.com](http://sundaysandseasons.com), this volume is intended as one key opening the treasures of the church's song so that the assembly's song might be enriched.

# FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

## YEAR A

### Introduction to the Day

The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake from sleep, for we know neither the day nor hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes among us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

### Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. By your merciful protection save us from the threatening dangers of our sins, and enlighten our walk in the way of your salvation, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.<sup>1</sup>

*Alleluia.* Show us your steadfast love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation. *Alleluia.* (Ps. 85:7)

# YEAR B

## Introduction to the Day

Stir up your power, and come! The psalmist’s plea in Psalm 80:2 has become familiar to us in the Advent prayers. Isaiah wants God to rip the heavens open. Both cry out for an apparently distant, angry God to show up, to save, to restore. When we hear Jesus describing the coming of the Son of Man with stars falling from heaven, it can sound dire and horrible, not like anything we would ever hope for. But when we really look at the suffering of people God loves, we can share the hope that God would tear open the heavens and come.

## Prayer of the Day

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. By your merciful protection awaken us to the threatening dangers of our sins, and keep us blameless until the coming of your new day, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.<sup>2</sup>

# YEAR C

## Introduction to the Day

Advent is about the “coming days.” God’s people have always lived in great expectation, but that expectation finds specific, repeated enunciation in the texts appointed for these four weeks. The ancients anticipated a “righteous Branch to spring up for David.” The Thessalonians awaited “the coming of our Lord Jesus with all the saints.” Jesus’ contemporaries hoped for the time “to stand before the Son of Man.” With them we eagerly await the coming days: another Christmas celebration, a second coming, and the advent of Christ in word and supper.

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. By your merciful protection alert us to the threatening dangers of our sins, and redeem us for your life of justice, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.<sup>3</sup>

Receive them with thanksgiving.

Benevolent, merciful God: When we are empty, fill us. When we are weak in faith, strengthen us. When we are cold in love, warm us, that with fervor we may love our neighbors and serve them for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.<sup>166</sup>
