Blessing of Worship Furnishings



This order may precede the primary service of the congregation, especially when the furnishings are to be used throughout the service. It may also precede the prayers of intercession.

The presiding minister may lead the prayer from the location of the furnishing being dedicated.

The presiding minister addresses the assembly.

Sisters and brothers, today we give thanks to God and we seek God's blessing as we set apart *this* ______ to the glory of God.

Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, creator of the universe, for you have enriched our lives with every good and perfect gift; you have commanded us to show your splendor to our children; and you have invited us to praise you with lives of love, justice, and joy.

Tower bell/s or carillon

Send your blessing on *this bell*, which we set apart today; may *it* faithfully call people to worship and proclaim to the world your presence.

Cross/crucifix

Send your blessing on this *cross/crucifix*, which we set apart today; may this sign of your Son's triumph draw us to him who leads us with this banner of salvation.

Candlesticks/lamps/torches

Send your blessing on these *candlesticks/lamps/torches*, which we set apart today; may they be to us a sign of Christ, the Light of the world, the light no darkness can overcome.

Bible/s, lectionary book/s

Send your blessing on *this Bible / lectionary book*, which we set apart today; may our hearts burn within us as you open to us the scriptures, and may your holy wisdom lead us to salvation.

Paten/chalice/communion vessels

Send your blessing on this paten / chalice / communion vessels, which we set apart today; may all who receive the *bread of heaven and the cup of blessing* be sustained by your grace and power.

Paraments/banners

Send your blessing on *these paraments/banners*, which we set apart today; may *they* adorn this house, show us the beauty of holiness, and so proclaim the glory of your majesty.

Vestments

Send your blessing on *these vestment/s*, which we set apart today; may those who wear *them* serve you in humility, and may all your people, clothed with Christ in baptism, worship you with the saints robed in light around your throne.

Funeral pall

Send your blessing on this pall, which we set apart today; may it be a reminder that in baptism we are clothed in the righteousness of Christ, and that in death we are received into the arms of your mercy.

Windows

Send your blessing on *these window/s*, which we set apart today; as the light shining through *them* is transformed into still greater splendor, so may our lives show the beauty of your manifold gifts of grace.

Visual art/sculpture/icon

Send your blessing on *this* ______, which we set apart today; may the material things of your creation, shaped by human hands, draw our hearts to things that can be seen only by the eye of faith.

General

Send your blessing on *this* ______, which we set apart today; may *it* serve to increase our vision of your glory, to remind us of your goodness, and to support our calling to worship you in spirit and truth.

General

Send your blessing on *this* ______, which we set apart today; may we make use of *it* in reverence and love, giving glory to your holy name.

The prayer concludes:

To you, O God, be all glory and honor through your Son, Jesus Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.⁸⁵⁴ **Amen.**
