NOTE: This setting may be sung as a responsorial psalm with the congregation singing the melody (soprano) line of the refrain "Sing to the Lord, sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things." If performed in this way, a cantor may sing the first statement of this refrain followed by its repetition by congregation (in unison) with choir (in parts). In this case, the repetition of the refrain at the beginning should be sung strongly (not as an echo). The verses between the statements of the refrain should be sung by a cantor or by soloists. It may be desirable to repeat the final statement of the refrain.
