

Faith on the Go!


Next time you're in line, **let** the person behind you cut in front of you.

What! Eric got his allowance? But I got everything done first this week! And without complaining! Mom and Dad didn't even have to remind me! How is this possible?


This is sooooo not fair.

Fun Facts

A **vineyard** is a plantation of grape-bearing vines, grown mainly for winemaking, but also raisins, table grapes, and grape juice.

The science, practice, and study of vineyard production is known as **viticulture**.

The oldest productive vineyard is claimed to be located in Maribor, Slovenia, home of a **400-year-old grapevine**.

Two thousand pounds (907 kg) of grapes fit in the bed of a **pickup**.

Thirty-seven pounds (17.6 kg) of grapes fit in a large **backpack**.

Harvesting grapes by **hand** remains the preferred method.
